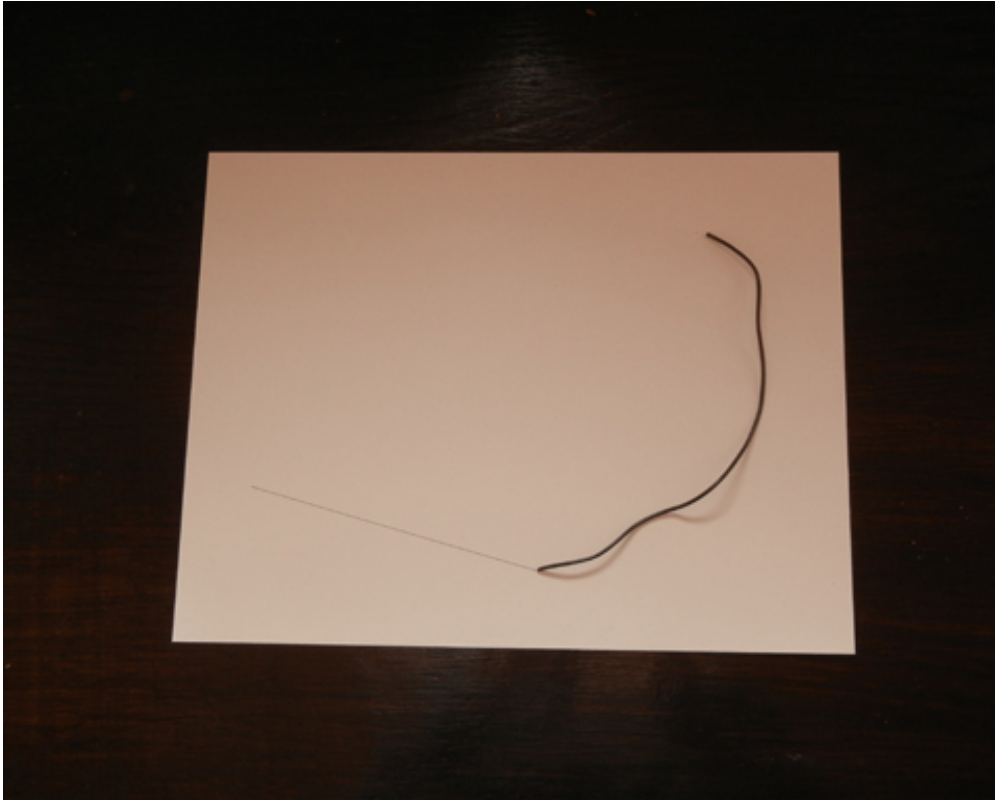

She uses different kind of materials, such as wood, steel frame, wire and acryl, mirror. There materials go through deformation, construction and dismantling and arranged as each work.

After the removal of original texture of each part, we find the simple form of subtle color and lines.

She has created minimum works since she became the member of “Gutai” in the late twenties.

These days her areas of activity are expanding, as Tochigi Prefectural Museum of Fine Arts(2005), the National Art Center of Tokyo(2012) and so on.

We also hold a talk event by Akiko HORIO and Sadaharu HORIO.
